1. Plant the Right Tree in the Right Place.

Use *waterwise* species.

2. Take Care of Trees.

Keep trees watered during hot, dry periods. Check out *Waterwise Tree Care*.

Prune correctly and for a reason. Trees require different pruning during their various life stages.
